About the Job:

We are accepting applications for a full-time, permanent **Occupational Therapist** in our Peterborough or Lindsay/Minden location.

In this position, you will assess, treat, provide consultation to and discharge children and adolescents referred for occupational therapy providing both school based, in-centre and/or feefor service. You will provide consultation, training and education to clients, their caregivers and other professionals. You will also have the opportunity to participate as a member of the department, clinical multidisciplinary teams and resource committees to promote quality service for clients.

Your key responsibilities will include:

- Assess, treat, provide education and training to caregivers and other professionals; reassess and discharge clients on caseload.
- Develop a service plan in consultation with caregivers.
- Maintain knowledge of current best treatment practice for client population and integrate into practice.
- Comply with relevant Centre statistical, clinical and administrative reporting requirements in a timely manner.
- Supervise occupational therapy interns and rehab assistant students.
- Maintain strict confidentiality regarding all information pertinent to the children and families served by the Centre.

What You Bring:

- Bachelor's or Master's degree in Occupational Therapy.
- Registration with the College of Occupational Therapists of Ontario.

- Paediatric, in-centre and school-based rehabilitation service experience considered an asset, but not required.
- Experience and understanding of a Family Centred Care model of service delivery.
- Excellent communication skills and proven ability to work as part of a team with professionals, support staff, and other community agencies.
- Creative problem solving skills.
- Solution Focused Coaching training is considered an asset.
- Ability and willingness to attain certifications required to work within the department (i.e. ADP individual authorizer status, NDT certification, etc.).
- Access to reliable transportation and ability to travel to a variety of locations.
- Clear vulnerable sector check and proof of COVID-19 vaccination required.
